While Michigan state standards serve as our overall guide, we are not bound by them. As a nonpublic school, we have the ability to take the good and discard the bad. The standards are the minimum attainment points, but we aim much higher.

Our professional educators make decisions about:

- What order to go in
- How long to spend on each topic
- Depth or intensity
- What to use for instruction
- What to use for assessment
- What field trips or supplemental resources will enhance the learning

We also set clear exit goals for our graduates that include:

- 1. The attitudes we desire them to have
- 2. The knowledge they should believe to be true
- 3. The things we encourage them to continue doing beyond graduation

The students receive instruction in all subjects required by the Michigan Department of Education. Teachers strive to integrate God's Word into all subject matter.
